



July 16, 2017 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Last week, Father Alford wrote about the program Called and Sent, and shared on the importance of discipleship, and a few ways we encounter Jesus. He closed with an exhortation that all of us will become missionary disciples that Christ is calling us to be.

This brings us to the fact that a group of approximately 31 people from the parish, including myself, will be in Roanoke, Virginia this week for a Catholic Heart Work Camp (CHWC). These Work Camps give the opportunity for High School students and their adult chaperones to go on a mission trip, to help people in need.

When we are in right relationship with Jesus, we're not static; we don't care only about ourselves. At the Second Vatican Council, a document called *Ad Gentes* (On the Mission Activity of the Church), was promulgated on December 7th, 1965. The first line of the first chapter states: "The pilgrim Church is missionary by her very nature, since it is from the mission of the Son and the mission of the Holy Spirit that she draws her origin, in accordance with the decree of God the Father." (paragraph 2)

The understanding of the "pilgrim Church" reminds us that as Christians, particularly as Catholics, we are on a pilgrimage, on a journey, through this life, to our destination: Heaven (God willing and us cooperating). One of the opportunities that pilgrims have, and are called to pursue, is the sharing of our faith. We share our faith both through our words and our actions. Catholic Heart Work Camp allows that opportunity for high school students and their chaperones throughout the country and at some international sites. We have the opportunity of witnessing to and serving one another on the trip, helping us to (hopefully) grow in patience and charity.


We also have the opportunity to share our faith through serving those in need in particular ways throughout this week, whether it's painting, yard work, helping at daycare centers, food distribution centers, or home repair/maintenance. When we take our missionary responsibility seriously, we live out the Gospel; we grow in right relationship with ourselves, one another, and the Holy Trinity. I ask you to pray for those of us who are going to Roanoke this week and for those whom we serve.
