**It's Official .....Formally Installed**

This past Tuesday evening, Fr. Daniel Bergbower, Dean of the Springfield Deanery, came to preside at a prayer service in our Church of St. Jude. Fr. Bergbower formally installed Fr. Chuck as our new pastor. Following those who have been blessed to be a part of our parish history as former pastors: Fr. Kozak, Fr. Paynic, Fr. Campbell, Fr. Loughran CSV, Fr. Gorman, CSV, Fr. Monahan CSV, Fr. Carpenter CSV, Fr. Cahill CSV, Fr. Probst, & Fr. Alford; I now believe I become the 11<sup>th</sup> pastor of St. Jude's parish, which began in 1973.

I invited key leadership folks in our parish to be present and witness this installation. It was a nice evening, and I am so grateful to those who attended. My short remarks at the service centered on how God has called all of us to a unique ministry of leading our parish faith community. Many thanks to Barb in our parish office for contacting the folks to come, and to Carrie Zucco, who set up our social afterwards as our host offering one of the four pillars of stewardship (Hospitality). I was really happy to be able to meet all these wonderful parishioners and parish leaders.

We will now begin to work together, in a collaborative spirit, to "pastor" our parish family. Stewardship/Discipleship will be a key component of the viability of our parish family. Worship and Prayer with great focus on "sacramental life" will continue to be at the heart of our parish life.

I am so happy to have the great assistance of both of our parish deacons. They have helped me a lot already with their knowledge of parish life here at St. Jude's. They, along with their wives, give much to our parish. I hope and pray that others will answer the call to the Permanent Diaconate. I had dinner with our

parish seminarian, Nicholas Lindstrom. Seems to be a fine young man. He will enter his third year of studies come August. I promised and pledged our parish support as he discerns his call to the priesthood. We spoke of "Vocations" at our gathering after the installation on Tuesday.

We are presently looking for someone or a group to accept the ministry of "Live Streaming" our weekend mass for those who still are home bound. If we could get four or five folks to do this together, you would only have to record it or live stream the mass once a month. Please respond soon if you are feeling called to help in this important ministry.

We will be putting together our "end of the year report" for the Fiscal year 2019–2020 church year. I look forward to sharing with you a kind of a "State of the Parish" address (done once a year) by the end of July or first weekend of August.

I am looking for someone to clean the rectory on Wednesday, every two weeks. It would be for four hours. If you are interested, call Barb at the parish office. She can fill you in on the full job description. I keep the rectory always in an orderly fashion and very clean.

At present on the books, we have 584 families with 1721 parishioners registered. We have many folks who give on a regular basis (check in collection multiple times) but have not made that "Commitment" to join the parish. I hope you will make that choice. I registered the other day, how about joining me? I want to get to know each and every one of you. My YES to the Lord in being installed as pastor is all about helping you (and me too) to reach our eternal goal, of life eternal with the Lord. Come join us. Come back if you have strayed. Let me know what I can do to support you.

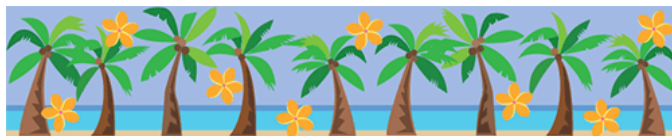

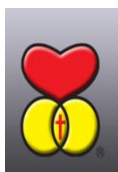

**The "wow!" factor**

After the final notes concluded at a recent symphony performance in Boston, the conductor hadn't yet lowered his baton when a child exclaimed, "Wow!" The break in protocol, magnified by excellent acoustics, didn't upset the participants or audience, however. Instead, several later said it brought them great joy. One even called the moment life-changing.

The incident was especially meaningful because the child, a 9-year-old named Ronan, has autism and is generally nonverbal. Music, his family says, tends to attract his interest and make him happy. When symphony officials learned Ronan's identity, they arranged a private performance so he could meet some musicians.

How often do you shout "Wow!" — in a good way — at what you see and hear? You may tend to do so on vacation or while observing God's natural wonders, but what about during your day-to-day life? Think about the people you encounter and their talents — and your own. When have these sparked a "Wow!" of thanks to God?

Every blessing, large or small, is a wow-moment — a gift from God that warrants our praise.
