One of the resources that we have available to help with this is our parish subscription to FORMED.org. I've invited people to explore this resource, but I see that only 34 parishioners have registered as users. That tells me that it's still a well kept secret, but I'm letting you in on that secret and inviting you to check it out! **Just go to** <https://stjuderochester.formed.org> and our **Parish Access code is 3VFNXZ**. When you log in to the website, you can click on the 'Study' link toward the top of the screen and you will be presented with quite a few options that address various topics, from Scripture, to the Sacraments, to the Creed. There are also movies, audiobooks, and audio talks available.

Another great place to explore is Ascension Press. They have a specific section for resources for small groups: <https://ascensionpress.com/small-groups>. Another option may be to just gather to pray and reflect on the Sunday readings that are coming up. Or maybe you can work your way through a book. There's great content on YouTube, with short videos by great Catholic speakers such as Bishop Robert Barron and Father Mike Schmitz. There are so many options, and if you feel stuck and are looking for some suggestions on a book or resource to use, please reach out to me and I'll be happy to lend my advice.

So, there you have it! What's next? Get together and start! Ask the Lord to bless your group and once the discussions start flowing, I think you'll be pleasantly surprised at how the Holy Spirit will take over and bring you into a deeper love for Christ and our Catholic faith!

What can 364 Catholic Heart Work Campers do in a community in 4 days of blistering heat and sleeping on the floor at Ranum Middle School?

At 102 different houses this year. We scraped caulked and completely painted 18 house on the outside, 57 rooms inside, scraped and painted 15 unattached garages and sheds, power washed 4 decks, repaired and completely rebuilt 2 decks, and stained 21 decks, rebuilt and stained 9 wheel chair ramps, stained 1500 foot of fencing, cleaned and washed 307 windows inside and out, scrubbed and cleaned 12 houses inside entirely, installed 15 light fixtures, cleaned and repaired 3360 foot of gutters, cleaned out 12 garages, help plant and weed 19 flower beds, pulled weeds at 31 different homes approximately ¾ of an acre, trimmed and cut grass at 8 homes, landscaped 16 yards, put down 72 bags of mulch, moved and help build 8 stone gardens, cut down trees at 19 homes, cut and trimmed trees and bushes at 28 homes, cut and loaded 28 pickups loads of tree and branches, but more than that we removed over 76 Hugh pickup loads of trash which sums up to 140 compressed cubic yards of trash, cleaned out 55 window wells, laid and repaired 1000 sq. foot of flooring, plus the subfloor, installed 15 post to repair fence and gates, built 150 foot of new fence, installed 120 foot of new guttering, installed and painted 10 new doors, remodeled 1 complete bathroom, replaced some siding on 4 houses, installed new screens at 6 homes, separated clothes at A Precious Child, painted and sorted food at Growing Home, took out and cleaned rock and replaced at 6 homes, repaired roof at 3 houses, took out and installed carpet at 2 homes, repaired soffet at 2 homes, built a 12 by 24 shed. This is what we recorded with believing that at least 25% more was done.

Yet, the most important part of all is that these 364 campers brought excitement for life and Christ to the homeowners as the home owners did to the campers. Our community (neighborhood) is different this week because of these campers that took time out of their summer to accomplish this. WHAT A PHENOMENAL AND UNBELIEVABLE FOUR DAYS!
