Over the past few weeks, we're reflected on the basic reason for and format of small groups and how they can be a key ingredient in helping us in growing in our relationship with Jesus Christ and thus becoming more intentional disciples. But hearing about something and actually doing it are two very different things.

I'm reminded of a scene from the Acts of the Apostles when St. Paul visited the great city of Athens. He preached to a large crowd about the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead, inviting them to turn to this new way of life made available to them as followers of Christ. After hearing this, the Bible recounts the following reaction from the people: "When they heard about resurrection of the dead, some began to scoff, but others said, 'We should like to hear you on this some other time.'" (Acts 17:32)

I share this with you because that can be our reaction after hearing about something new which invites us to take action. That could be the encouragement to form a small group, to begin a practice of reading the Bible each day, or going back to Confession. We can easily fall into the thought: "That sounds good, but now is not the time, maybe later." That's always a great danger in the spiritual life, to delay our following-up on the promptings of the Holy Spirit to follow the Lord more intentionally in our lives.

I don't speak as one who has this skill mastered by any means! I have resolutions from prayer, retreats, and reading all of the time, many of which never come to fruition. But when I do follow those promptings, the Lord has never been outdone in His generosity.

Whether you join a small group or not (and I sincerely hope you do), I hope you have a heightened awareness of the many ways that the Lord is inviting you to take the next step forward in your faith. I'd like to conclude with a quote from Pope Francis that came at the conclusion on the Homily for Canonization of St. Junipero Serra, a Franciscan missionary who brought the Catholic faith to many in the state of California. They are words which summarize how we as Catholics should view our journey of faith:

Father Serra had a motto which inspired his life and work, not just a saying, but above all a reality which shaped the way he lived: *siempre adelante!* Keep moving forward! For him, this was the way to continue experiencing the joy of the Gospel, to keep his heart from growing numb, from being anesthetized. He kept moving forward, because the Lord was waiting. He kept going, because his brothers and sisters were waiting. He kept going forward to the end of his life. Today, like him, may we be able to say: Forward! Let's keep moving forward!


