



**October 28, 2018**

**30<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time**

For one full summer while I was in the seminary, I attended a program in Omaha, Nebraska called the Institute for Priestly Formation. During that summer, we focused on the pillar of spiritual formation, learning more about the importance of prayer and how to enter more deeply into a personal relationship with Jesus through various forms of prayer, especially praying with the Scriptures.

A classmate of mine and I would regularly go for a walk around the campus of Creighton University where the program was held. During those walks, we would pray the Rosary together. One of the directors of the program saw us doing this one day and he offered us a recommendation on how to pray the Rosary in a more reflective way. He invited us, at the end of each decade of the Rosary, to ask the Lord what He wanted us to learn from the mystery that we had just prayed. We would then share with one another what the Lord revealed to us. I was amazed at how that simple suggestion really deepened my praying of the Rosary, and so I pass it on to all of you as another way of getting more out of your praying of the Rosary.

You may not always have another person with whom to pray the Rosary, and that is fine. The same principle is still there. Just take a few moments at the end of the decade to let the Lord speak to you about the mystery. I find that knowing that I am going to be asking the Lord that question at the end of the decade really helps me to pay attention to the particular mystery as I am praying it. And when you do this practice with somebody else, you are really trying to pay attention as you want to be able to share *something* when you get to the end of the decade.

I often combine all of the practices that I have mentioned in these bulletin articles when I pray the Rosary. I find that it's easiest for me to do this when I go running. Not to sound overly pious, but it is often the Rosary that motivates me to get up and go for a run. I initially stumbled upon this when doing cardio exercise at the gym, which can be extremely boring, especially when on a treadmill! I still don't love running all that much, but when I combine it with the Rosary or the Stations of the Cross, it becomes more bearable and I actually find that I am able to pray those devotions much better. So, why not give that a shot? Maybe you don't like running, try it while walking, or biking, or on the elliptical machine. That way, you are strengthening your body and your soul!
