

March 3, 2019 8th Sunday of Ordinary Time

In just a few days, we will be entering the holy season of Lent, the 40 days during which we prepare for the celebration of Easter. The Church

requires very little of us during Lent (see the regulations later in the bulletin), but she encourages us to adopt a voluntary program of self-denial, more intense prayer, and acts of charity.

Last Lent, I received a daily e-mail with a short reflection for the day. I remember well the very first reflection that landed in my inbox on Ash Wednesday. The reflection drew from the following line in Luke's Gospel: "When the days for His being taken up were fulfilled, He resolutely *determined* to journey to Jerusalem." (Lk 9:51) The reflection went on with the following words, which I would like to share with you:

Just as Jesus is starting a sacred journey, we too are starting the journey of Lent - and a journey with Jesus. For many of us, Lent is a time when we adopt Lenten penances, special commitments to God, so that we may grow in holiness. However, too often our Lenten penances take the shape of our New Year's resolutions; we mean well at the beginning, however, when life gets busy our determination atrophies and we give up. As Jesus is **determined** to fulfill His journey. are you determined to follow Him? Are you "resolutely determined" to follow Him? Jesus is looking at you . . . right now. He is asking . . . right now. Are you determined to go all the way to Jerusalem?

In these days leading up to Ash Wednesday, I would invite you to pray for the desire to be **resolutely determined** to follow Jesus more faithfully during this Lenten season. Don't just focus on the *what* of Lent, but the *why*, which is growing in our awareness of God's profound love for us, an awareness that, when fully appreciated, cannot leave us unchanged in how we live our lives as His beloved disciples. So let's begin Lent well, and believe that by staying determined throughout this season, this Lent could be the Lent that changes our lives!

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

Prayer Abstinence – (1) Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fast – (2) Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not allowed.

(3) To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

EXTREME Abortion Bills Introduced in IL Legislature

House Bill 2467 & Senate Bill 1594:

Repeals Illinois Parental Notification of Abortion Act

Current law requires a parent or legal guardian be notified when a minor seeks an abortion. Includes a waiver for children physically or sexually abused. Passed in 1995 but not implemented until 2013 by a *unanimous* Illinois Supreme Court ruling.

House Bill 2495 & Senate Bill 1942:

- Repeals current state ban on partial-birth abortions.
- Defines abortion as a fundamental right.
- Removes abortion clinics from regulations for serious medical procedures.
- Removes the requirement that only doctors can perform abortions.
- We are studying the bill for further impact.
