



## May 26, 2019 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter

Tomorrow, our nation marks its annual observance of Memorial Day.

People often mark this weekend as the official beginning of summer. Students are graduating from school, classes are letting out, vacations are getting started, and many other good things happen around this time of year that mark a sort of shift for the coming months.

More than anything, though, this is a day for remembering. After all, the name of the day is 'memorial', which has to do with using our memory. According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Memorial Day "commemorates the men and women who died while in the military service." In 2000, a resolution was passed calling for a National Moment of Remembrance on that day at 3:00 pm local time, during which Americans are asked "to voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a Moment of Remembrance and Respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to 'Taps.'" Think of how little this is in comparison to the sacrifice made by so many. Therefore, amidst all of the things that you may be doing to celebrate the beginning of summer that day, please take a moment to remember those who have made it possible for us to enjoy these freedoms.

And since it is the beginning of summer, I would like to remind you of our weekly Moment of Remembrance, also known as Sunday Mass, during which we remember the greatest sacrifice of all, the death of Jesus Christ on the Cross, through which He defeated sin and death and opened the gates to eternal life in Heaven. There are 168 hours in a week. Think of how little it is to give Him one hour each week in comparison to that great sacrifice He made for the freedom you enjoy of being His beloved son or daughter. Amidst all those many good activities this summer, please take that hour of remembrance each week to thank God for His continued blessings in your life.

Here in the Springfield area, we are blessed with an abundance of Mass times, beginning at 4 pm on Saturday evening, then with masses on Sunday going on at almost every hour from 7 am to noon, then with Sunday evening Masses at 5:00 pm at the Cathedral and Christ the King. There's even an 8:00 pm Mass on Sunday evening at Sacred Heart Church (St. Katharine Drexel Parish).
