In last week's bulletin, I introduced the term 'Restore Order', which means we are returning to the intended sequence of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation, with Confirmation no longer being the final of these three sacraments but restoring the Eucharist to the final position as is theologically correct.

It is helpful to have a little history to explain how the order got thrown off. Around the 5th century, as the Church continued to spread out, bishops started the practice of celebrating Confirmation after baptism, mainly due to their availability. Up to that time, the norm had been for the bishop to both baptize and confirm people, usually infants, at the same time. Under the new practice, the bishop would come to complete the initiation begun by the local pastors. For the most part, this remained the practice until the 1840's. At that time, some French bishops chose to move the age of Confirmation to be later so as to allow for a longer period of formation. Pope Leo XIII was critical of this practice, but it continued and Confirmation was being received at a later age. In 1910, Pope St. Pius X lowered the age of reception for First Holy Communion to the age of reason, roughly 7 years old. However, nothing was said about Confirmation and how its reception would factor into this new scheme. The Church, however, envisioned that Confirmation be received at or around the age of reason, though it gave some flexibility for regions to set norms as to when the sacrament would be received. What resulted was the Eucharist being received at the age of reason, then Confirmation was delayed to a later time, sometimes even several years later.

From this, two things emerged. Less frequently (but not infrequently) after First Holy Communion, children fell away from the normal catechetical formation process and never received Confirmation at all. More frequently, we have seen Catholics leaving the regular practice of their faith after receiving Confirmation at these later ages, seeing it as a sort of "Catholic graduation." In response to these two effects of delaying Confirmation, many in the Church have raised the question about whether returning to the original sequence of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation would be helpful. To be sure, nobody is claiming that returning to Restored Order is a silver bullet, but I think there
