



November 1, 2020 Solemnity of All Saints

When we mention the word “saint”, I believe that it is natural to automatically think of Paul, Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Mary, or you can name your saint.

There is nothing wrong in this thinking, I do it myself. However, I feel we must broaden our idea of “saint” and look more closely at our present day surroundings. The Oxford Dictionary defines a saint as a noun: a person acknowledged as holy or virtuous and typically regarded as being in heaven after death or a very virtuous, kind, or patient person. In the Church, we use the verb meaning to formally recognize as a saint; canonize.

Without any major effort, you can probably think of someone you would consider a “saint” in your life. It could be a family member, a friend, or maybe even a casual acquaintance. I have several people who have touched me in my life that I consider saints.

In looking back at her life, my mother is/was a saint. My mother was not Catholic, nor was I raised Catholic, but she had her Bible and a belief system that encouraged her and sustained her through some turbulent times. She was married to an alcoholic husband who died when I was 12 years old and when she remarried, the family went from 4 children to 11 children. Her love and compassion never ceased for anyone and she adopted and raised a granddaughter as well.

As she was dying in the hospital, those that were there gathered in her room as I read 2Timothy 6-8, and yes, I gave her a blessing. She ran the race, she competed well, she loved her Bible, God, and family. What more could we ask of a saint?

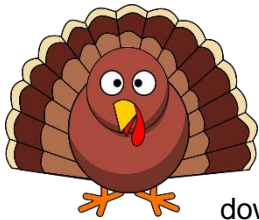
PSR NEWS

Parish Nurse Program

Back in the late 1980's. the "Parish Nurse Program" was conceived and began in our Diocese (in Quincy). This program is being used in many parishes throughout the United States. Usually a part-time position, the outreach ministry of health and wholeness enables a nurse to reach out and connect mainly with our home bound folks unable to come to church due to age and health issues. The program also offers the opportunity for parish led "Health Fairs", usually twice a year (Spring/Fall) to be held at our parish center, with the help of those in the health care field hosting an event to offer health care materials and brochures to promote healthy ways of living. Frances Yocum has accepted my invitation to begin the ministry as a Parish Nurse. Donna Spurlock is willing to help. We will soon be contacting others from our parish in this profession who would like to join this outreach ministry.

The COVID-19 Pandemic has filled our World with fear, anxiety and sadness, especially for the homeless or those who are fearing homelessness due to losing a job or being evicted. It could be you or me. We have to help those people that God places in our paths every day of our lives. The Mission of this project is to take these Goody Bags or Baked Goods and pass them out to our homeless neighbors, low income families or lonely Seniors. FAITH IN ACTION!! We need to be an example for our children!

If you would like to make Goody Bags for the Homeless, here are some of their likes and wants: Fruit Cups, Cookies, Muffins, Candy bars (soft), Gum, Bottled Water and Flavor Powder Pkts, Gatorade, Cocoa Mixes, Crackers, Healthy Chips, Granola Bars, Apple slices, Oranges, Toothbrush & Toothpaste, Deodorant, Socks, Hat, Gloves & Scarves, Hand and Feet Warmers, Religious Prayer Cards and Religious items, and knife/fork/spoon pkts.

If you would like to bake or make and individually package and deliver: Cookies, cupcakes, muffins, banana or pumpkin breads, or homemade candies, they would be greatly appreciated. They don't get a lot of homemade things and I know they really appreciate it!!

When you are delivering Goody Bags and/or Baked Goods to the homeless or low income families, if you have any of the following items, they are always needed and welcomed: Blankets, Sleeping Bags and/or Clothes to keep them warm are always needed.

Please ensure, while preparing the Goody Bags or Baskets and delivering the items, that you are practicing cleanliness and social distancing.

Sunday, November 8th, will be our delivery day. We will meet at the Parish Center at 12p. If you would like to prepare the Goody Bags, Baked Goods or Baskets and are unable to deliver them, we can help get them delivered. You can drop these items off at the Parish Center and place in the Kitchen marked "Faith in Action-Love Thy Neighbor".

If you know of a family who is struggling or a lonely Senior in need, please contact me with their name, address and phone number if you have it. I would be more than happy to reach out to them and connect them to community resources specific to their needs.

Baptism: a family seeking baptism for their children must be registered in our parish (not under your parents' names) and actively living their sacramental life for at least 6 months. Both parents must attend a baptismal class for their own formation regarding this sacrament. The God parents are encouraged to attend. God-parents/or Christian witnesses must be baptized, and one must be actively living their Catholic faith. All God parents (outside of St. Jude parishioners) must be baptized, 16 years of age or older, and must bring in a letter of suitability from their parish pastor stating you are registered and actively living their sacramental life.

Marriage: those who are seeking to be married at St. Jude Church must be registered in our parish and actively living their sacramental life. One of the couple or both must be Catholic and a parishioner of St. Jude Parish. Couples must first come by the office and ask for a copy of the guidelines for the Sacrament and make sure all looks good. The couple (not their parents) then must contact Fr. Chuck or the parish office for an appointment to meet, talk about the guidelines, and then together set a date; all done at that first appointment, not on the phone before the meeting or when you pick up the guidelines.
