Catechumenate “RCIA” Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA) is the sacramental process for the pastoral formation and guidance, aimed at training new members in the Christian life.

These sacramental norms apply to the unbaptized who are 6 or 7 years of age and older. They apply to the baptized uncatechized Catholics who are 6 or 7 years of age and older who were baptized in infancy but celebrated neither Confirmation nor First Holy Communion. And they apply to the baptized Christians who are 6 or 7 years of age and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church.

These norms have been in place since 1988 in this diocese and in all the dioceses of the United States of America.

PSR and Youth Ministry Update!

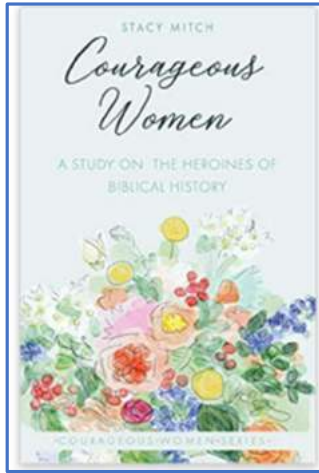
Here are a few things to keep in mind, as PSR is getting ready to gear up again!

- FIRST DAY BACK is Wednesday, September 8th!
- As you know, Governor Pritzker has mandated that all schools require masks. In addition to this mandate, the Rochester School District has stated that masks will be required in all indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status. We have been informed by the diocese to follow the local school district. This means, that for all PSR and Youth Ministry Programs we will be requiring masks for all, regardless of vaccination status. As the district changes their plans, we will fall in line. A full return to learn plan will be sent to all registered families.
- We do offer a homeschool option. This option is for the entire year, and you are given the teaching materials to teach at home, at your own pace. If you choose this option, we have books available for all grades, however, for some grades they won't match what we are doing in the classroom. This is especially important to note for the 4-8th, as they will be using a youth group approach in the classroom which does not follow a standard curriculum.
- We will have lessons posted online for each grade, K-3. This is different than homeschooling. These lessons are for those who are sick, quarantined, or working from home for a short time. If you intend, to work from home the entire year, you need to choose the homeschool option above.
- Due to a higher than expected registration between the 4-6th grades, we will be moving the 6th grade up to be with the 7-8th grade. The 4-5th grade will remain together.
- Due to a lower than expected registration between Kindergarten and First grade, we will be combining these two grades together.

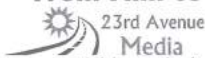

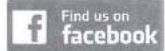
