I wanted to take a moment and share with you what we have done and what we plan to do, to continue growing this fire!

As all know, we completed a fantastic year of PSR in May. PSR is about to begin again in a couple weeks and with a whole new look! Due to low kindergarten registration, we have combined our K-1st grade and they have a brand new curriculum that is much more engaging for our smallest of learners! Our second graders receive First Reconciliation and begin the preparation for moving to third grade where they continue the preparation for their Confirmation and First Eucharist!

Following Confirmation our youth are invited to continue their faith journey with youth groups! And we are excited to have 3! Our 4th-5th graders will be together in Moved, and our 6th-8th graders will be together in Driven, both on Wednesdays during PSR. During the summer before school begins, our 8th graders will join our current High Schoolers on Sundays and they will continue with Propelled. Each youth group has a weekly topic, Bible study, activities, and small/whole group discussions geared toward each age group! The lessons are fun, interactive, and engaging!

Our youth groups are still young, but we look forward to growing and offering many experiences to help them become and remain excited about their faith. Our high schoolers have already participated in a Lock-In, fundraising for NCYC, and will be looking ahead to the Mission Trip for the summer of 2022 as well! We hope to provide some activities for our 4-8th graders that extend past the classroom as well, so stay tuned!

This summer, we also began to look at the return of Adult Faith Formation! Deacon Tom Walker will be getting our Men's Bible Study up and going soon, and our Women's Bible Study has already begun! With 21 fantastic ladies we spend each Thursday afternoon discussing the courageous women of the Bible. It has been so interesting learning more about these courageous women, and it has been equally rewarding learning more about the women in the group courageous enough to be on this journey with me.

Looking ahead to our Fall, we are excited to remind everyone about Steve Angrisano! Steve will be here November 13-16! Steve will be here to sing at all the weekend Masses, speak with the youth ...

... of our parish, and also provide a parish mission for our entire parish! Steve will then join us for NCYC in Indianapolis, IN from November 18-20. This will be a fantastic experience for those who attend- sharing in our faith together in worship, music, and fun!

Thank you for letting me catch you up and thank you for letting me be a part of your faith journey! I can't wait to see what the Lord has in store for us!

ANNOUNCEMENT: In light of Gov. Pritzker's August 26, 2021 mandate requiring masks indoors, we have made the decision to not offer communion under both species, but will offer the Body of Christ. While the mandate is effective Monday August 30th, our decision is to preemptively begin this coming weekend on August 28/29, thereby erring on the side of caution. In addition, the September, 2021 Ministry Schedule has been revised to require only Fr. Chuck plus one other Eucharist Minister at each service.

"Mask Requirement: To slow the spread of the highly transmissible COVID-19 Delta variant, all Illinois residents over the age of two will be required to wear a mask in all indoor settings, effective Monday, August 30th. The requirement is applicable to both vaccinated and unvaccinated residents statewide .."

Each family is asked to bring a dish to share as follows:

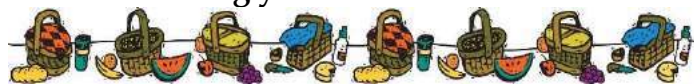

Catechumenate “RCIA”

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA) is the sacramental process for the pastoral formation and guidance, aimed at training new members in the Christian life.

These sacramental norms apply to the unbaptized who are 6 or 7 years of age and older. They apply to the baptized uncatechized Catholics who are 6 or 7 years of age and older who were baptized in infancy but celebrated neither Confirmation nor First Holy Communion. And they apply to the baptized Christians who are 6 or 7 years of age and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church.

These norms have been in place since 1988 in this diocese and in all the dioceses of the United States of America.

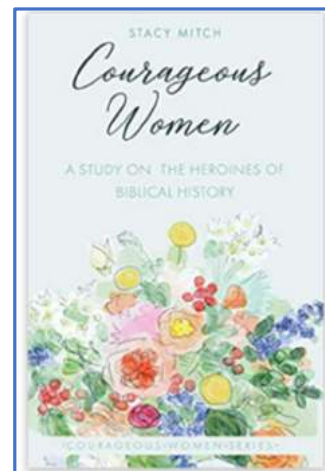
PSR and Youth Ministry Update!

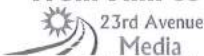

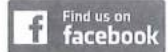
