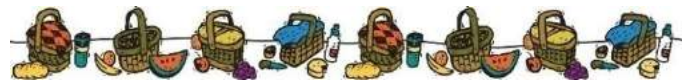

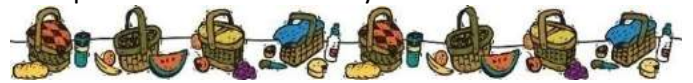

ANNOUNCEMENT: In light of Gov. Pritzker's August 26, 2021 mandate requiring masks indoors, we have made the decision to not offer communion under both species, but will offer the Body of Christ. While the mandate is effective Monday August 30th, our decision is to preemptively begin this coming weekend on August 28/29, thereby erring on the side of caution. In addition, the September, 2021 Ministry Schedule has been revised to require only Fr. Chuck plus one other Eucharist Minister at each service.

We provide the following text from the Governor's Office:

"Mask Requirement: To slow the spread of the highly transmissible COVID-19 Delta variant, all Illinois residents over the age of two will be required to wear a mask in all indoor settings, effective Monday, August 30th. The requirement is applicable to both vaccinated and unvaccinated residents statewide .."

Catechumenate “RCIA” Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the sacramental process for the pastoral formation and guidance, aimed at training new members in the Christian life.

These sacramental norms apply to the unbaptized who are 6 or 7 years of age and older. They apply to the baptized uncatechized Catholics who are 6 or 7 years of age and older who were baptized in infancy but celebrated neither Confirmation nor First Holy Communion. And they apply to the baptized Christians who are 6 or 7 years of age and seek to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church.

These norms have been in place since 1988 in this diocese and in all the dioceses of the United States of America.

- NOTE: all K-2nd graders need to be escorted in and out of the building by their parents before and after PSR!

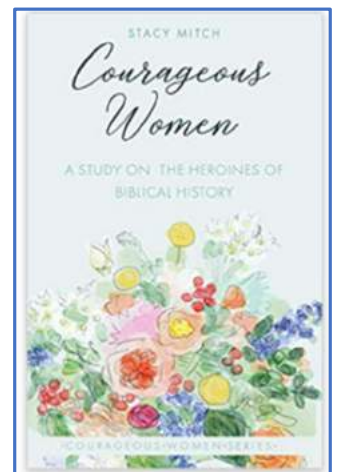


We are excited to announce that we will be going to NCYC this year!

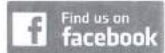
